Purina Parent Club Partnership (PPCP) Program

Members of Purina Pro Club whose national parent club participates in the Purina Parent Club Partnership (PPCP) Program may earn funding for canine health studies, education and/or rescue efforts that will benefit their breed. Since 2002, the first year of the PPCP program, there has been more then \$710,000 generated for health research, education or rescue. As of 2005, there are 149 National breed clubs participating in the program.

Here's how the PPCP Program works: Pro Club members redeem weight circles from bags of participating Purina brand dog foods. Purina tracks these weight circle submissions, and for every \$100 of qualifying weight circle points earned by Pro Club members, Purina donates \$10 to the participating national parent breed club.

Points are accumulated throughout a calendar year, and in February, a check representing 10 percent of the value of the submitted weight circles for the year is evenly split between the participating national parent breed club and the AKC Canine Health Foundation. The donation that goes to the AKC Canine Health Foundation is eligible to be matched up to 100 percent by the Canine Health Foundation if it meets the Foundation's funding guidelines.





Our question for this issue is: What is hypothyroidism?

Hypothyroidism (underactive thyroid gland) occurs when the thyroid does not produce sufficient levels of the hormone thyroxine. Thyroxine is a key hormone involved in nearly every metabolic process that occurs within the body. Hypothyroidism is a fairly common canine disease.

Symptoms:

- Weight gain
- Low energy levels/depression
- Dry, thinning hair/hair loss
- Dry skin
- Thickening of the skin
- Bacterial infections of the skin
- Hyperpigmentation (dark color) of the skin
- Constipation
- Feeling cold
- Infertility


Causes:

- Trauma or severe stress to the system (especially at a young age).
- Low levels of iodine in the diet. A kelp and vitamin E supplement will often correct the problem in this case (vitamin E helps the body properly utilize iodine).
- Autoimmune thyroiditis. The immune system attacks the thyroid for unknown reasons. A hypoallergenic diet (e.g.,

premium lamb and rice based food), omega fatty acids in the form of black currant oil and salmon oil, spirulina and vitamin E may provide relief. Your veterinarian may also determine that thyroid medication is necessary.

- Nutritional deficiency (especially zinc). Feed a premium food and offer an appropriate canine multivitamin/mineral supplement such as Pet Tabs Plus.
- Lack of light. Don't keep your dog in a dark area or turn out the lights too soon in the evening. Allow some exposure to natural sunlight and exercise each day.
- Idiopathic atrophy. Thyroid degeneration for unknown reasons.
- Medication used to treat hyperthyroidism (overactive thyroid gland) can cause hypothyroidism.

Diagnosis and Treatment:

A veterinary exam and blood test are necessary to diagnose hypothyroidism as the symptoms listed may be caused by other diseases as well. If your veterinarian determines that your dog has hypothyroidism, he/she will likely prescribe thyroxine.

The mineral zinc and the herb ginger root stimulate the thyroid gland. Diet, exercise, and exposure to light are also very important. With your veterinarian's cooperation, you might try the following treatment before resorting to thyroxine:

- Premium lamb and rice based dog food.
- One half of a Pet Tabs Plus supplement daily.
- One 200 mg. capsule of 4:1 concentrated ginger extract morning and evening. You can "hide" the capsule in a small piece of meat or canned food or sprinkle the contents over some canned food. Most dogs do not object to the taste.
- A teaspoon of Nupro and/or The Missing Link sprinkled over kibble daily.
- One Samolinic (Salmon, Black Currant Oil) soft gel morning and evening. Most dogs will eat the soft gel directly. If your dog does not eat the soft gel, you can prick it and squeeze the contents onto food.
- A minimum of ½ hour exercise daily.
- Exposure to light (with as much natural daylight as possible) for 12 hours each day.

- 1. I agree to follow the regulations as set forth by the American Kennel Club and the American Pomeranian Club Inc. as they pertain to purebred dogs.
- 2. I will furnish a signed registration application or transfer with each puppy sold, unless a written agreement stating the reason for withholding papers is made with the purchaser at the time of sale.
- 3. I will not sell my puppies to pet shops or commercial pet mill establishments, nor will I donate puppies for raffles or auctions.
- 4. I will not crossbreed or advertise for sale puppies that have been crossbred.
- 5. I will not provide stud service to bitches that are not registered with the AKC or an AKC recognized foreign registry.
- 6. Before I sell a puppy/dog, I will have said puppy/dog checked by my veterinarian and will furnish the buyer with a copy of the puppy/dog's immunization and health record. I will advise the purchaser of my puppy/dog to have the puppy/dog checked by a veterinarian within 72 hours of the sale unless a different specified time is agreed upon, in writing, by the seller and the buyer.
- 7. I will maintain the best possible standard of health and care in all of my dogs and see that puppies are immunized and checked for parasites.
- 8. In my breeding program I will work to control and/or eradicate inherited problems and conditions that are particular to Pomeranians.
- 9. I will not willingly or knowingly breed merle to merle, merle to brindle or merle to white or cream. If any offspring of a merle breeding (one or more of the ancestors is a merle) is born clear (no black or brown hair) the offspring will be DNA tested for the merle gene unless the offspring are sold on a spay/neuter agreement. Failure to comply may be considered to be actions not in the best interests of the breed and could result in unwanted merle to merle breedings that produce serious health issues.
- 10. I will adhere to the Breed Standard that is set forth by the American Pomeranian Club.
- 11. I will represent my dogs as honestly as possible to prospective buyers and try to assist the serious novice in their understanding of the breed. Further, if I send written or photographic representation of my dogs, these images shall represent the animal as it appears at the time, unless otherwise noted.
- 12. I acknowledge that the American Pomeranian Club recommends puppies are not sold before 10 weeks of age unless there are unusual and necessary circumstances.
- 13. The American Pomeranian Club recommends that the sale of all Poms be defined in a written contract between seller and buyer.
- 14. I will try at all times to show good sportsmanship and keep in mind that the good of the breed comes before any personal benefit and that the Club exists to protect the breed.



Junior and I have taken a break from breeding, and have not had a litter of puppies in well over a year. However, later in 2008 we hope to turn our attention back to the whelping box, and look forward having the first litter out of our Stetson and Paris daughter Ch Achilles Pardon My French. We also hope to see Chad, better known as BPIS Am & Can Ch Chriscendo Communicado, bred by Chris and John Heartz, owned by myself and Liz Heckert, handled in the states by Liz and Junior, and in Canada by Chris John, and achieve his ROM. We also anticipate having our first litters out of Houston and Macon sometime in late 2008 as well.

We have found the key ingredient to success in this sport, is the ability to correctly evaluate our dogs, avoid kennel blindness at all costs, and be honest with ourselves as to what positive qualities and shortcomings exist within each Pom we breed. As a newcomer to the sport of pure bred dogs, I was fortunate to read Pat Hastings' book "Tricks Of The Trade" which had a profound impact on how my eye for a dog

developed. We have used her methods evaluation on every litter we have bred, and feel it has been essential enabling us to continue to teach ourselves about the dogs we are working with, and what they produce.

A phrase commonly used in the dog game is "every dog has faults". This is of course true, and certainly applies to our own dogs. However, I believe the more important part of the equation lies in the merits a dog possesses. Over time, we have come to learn the lack of fault does not necessarily equal the presence of merit. Breeding is complicated on so many levels, but one of the things that has become increasingly clear to me, is the indispensable role a dog with merits plays in moving a breed program forward. This seems such a simple concept, but in fact, it is not. As often times a dog who has those unusual, or even outstanding virtues that set him apart, will also have issues that prevent him from being a big winner in the show ring.

A prime example of this is the two best litters we have bred to date. Each were sired by dogs with less than stellar show records. And for different reasons, could even be said to struggle in achieving their championships. Both dogs produced for me, and several others, puppies who had many of their wonderful qualities and none of the issues that prevented them from being big winners in the ring. They may not have lit the show ring on fire, but their kids sure did. I took away from that experience the knowledge that show records are not the litmus test I can use in determining the place a dog should hold in my breed program. Instead I concentrate on diversifying the faults in my breeding stock, while working towards developing that keen sense that a breeder must have to recognize dogs who have the ability to produce those highly valued traits that can be difficult to attain.

Another philosophy Junior and I have adopted, is the importance we place on using only good quality females as the dams of our litters. We found through experience the pups we produce tend to favor their mothers heavily in both type and structure. Therefore using only those girls who have positive features to pass along to their offspring is an absolute must for us. We look for females who have the same characteristics as their male counterparts, including good structure and movement, correct outlines, nice bone, pleasing heads, short backs, and are in our preferred four to five pound size

range. When planning a breeding we do not employ the thought process of finding a boy who can fix the faults of our girl. Instead we take the perspective of trying to find a pairing that will permit both the male and female to play off each others strong points, while not doubling on either of the pair's faults. This in turn will enable their offspring to inherit positive attributes from both their parents that they can then carry through to the next generation. That ideal of maintaining the quality on both sides of the pedigree we believe will serve our breed program well for future generations, while not limiting us on line breeding on our males as well as our females.

In our search for the kind of Poms we wish to work with, we have been fortunate to befriend what in my opinion are some of the top breeders in the Pom world today. In conclusion I'd like to thank Brenda for honoring us with a kennel visit. I'd also like to express my gratitude to her, the entire Pom Review staff, the APC Board, and all the committee chairs and members for the wonderful job they do. We all know Pomeranians are currently faced with many obstacles to overcome, such as ever constant anti-breeder legislation, questions on how to improve the overall health and soundness in our breeding stock, the ongoing debate over merle and its place in our breed, and last but certainly not least in finding a marker for coat loss so we can begin to turn the tide of this ever increasing problem. However, I would strongly urge us towards working together on solutions to these issues, instead of using them as a way to further divide us. Our generation of breeders did not create these dilemmas, so blaming one another and using them as a weapon with which to attack your fellow breeder is not only a waste of energy, but it discourages us from being honest with one another. And at the end of the day that only serves to hold us back from the solutions we owe our breed to find.

However, I know I speak for all of you when I say, "I wouldn't trade it for anything in the world." Many of you reading this have touched us through your sound advice, late night phone calls, shoulder to cry on, and supportive words about the Poms we have produced. Though there are too many of you to name individually, I just want to take a moment to say your kindness is much appreciated and you will always hold a special place in our hearts.






The most recent record Parker has broken is APC Top Producing Sire with a total of 77 champion get. Seven more Parker offspring are currently pointed and showing. Parker has been the APC top-producing sire in 2004, 2005, 2006, and 2007.

The first record Parker broke was earning the most number of Best In Shows (All Breed) as any other Pom in the history of the breed. Parker won 340 BOB, 43 BISA, 14 BISS, and earned his ROM, ROMX, ROMS all in the same year – 2004 (I believe this is a record too). In June 29-July 4, 2004, Parker became a Thailand grand champion in just 4 shows with three BISA and two reserves setting a Thailand record for earning this in just 4 shows and only 3 other poms had attained this award at that time. In 2006 Parker's son broke this record and I'm sure there have been several others since then.

MY IDEAL FACE

I first saw Parker at 9 months of age posted on the Internet as being available for sale from this picture. It was instant "love at first sight" because his face looked like the picture I had hanging on my bulletin board as the ideal face for over 40 years. I hurried to dial his breeder/owner, Virginia Dimick's phone number to let her know I wished to purchase Parker.

During the time after Parker finished his championship and his first night sleeping at my house, I remember Parker pushing his way to get into my house as I was letting in the poms that sleep in my bedroom. He ran back to my bedroom as if to say, this is where I belong too! He was very pushy about what he wanted. He's been a bed buddy ever since. So when I got to see him win a Best In Show for the first time, I marveled at how much he loved the clapping and cheering and how he would throw his head back even further and his chest out and strut his stuff. He seemed to know all that cheering was for him and he loved it! And he seemed to have a smile on his face very similar to this look.

Parker's pedigree is the kind I like, representing several bloodlines and Parker has the look and the type I like to breed – he has the ideal. He is very consistent in what he throws; they look like his offspring. He is especially prepotent for the outgoing, bold, brave spirit that makes such a good show dog. He also throws his type and he's a correct fluid mover.

Parker, like Travis (BISA, BISS, Ch. Finch's He Walks On Water, ROMS, GC, HOF) has a pedigree that includes more than one bloodline, so, like Travis, he nicks very well with most. Since I breed for type, I can use any

individual from any bloodline that shows the type I like. Parker combines well paired with my Travis daughters and granddaughters for exceptional movement.

Parker's offspring are just delightful little personalities. Their correct type, beauty, movement and huge coats are what I've always wanted. He has been a terrific asset to my parti breeding program with one of his first granddaughters easily finishing her championship in a short time. If I wished to pursue chocolate, he has also thrown some pretty outstanding chocolates.

Parker has several notable offspring and grandkids that have also won numerous BISAs and honors. His sons Ch. How We Do It

RAISING THE FADING PUPPY Mrs. William Baulch Reprinted from December 1961 Pomeranian Review

I did not dream I would receive an avalanche of letters requesting more information. I am delighted. Never again will I believe most breeders wouldn't fool with the weak ones. I'm thoroughly convinced that most breeders, both large and small, want to save their puppies.

Rectal feedings are resorted to only in extreme emergencies, where the puppy cannot swallow or is so far gone that oral feeding would be useless. No matter how careful you are there will be tiny sore rectums. Cod liver ointment, which you can secure from your veterinarian, is a must if you are to feed in this manner. Keep the little ones well greased with this ointment. This type of feeding is excellent for the little blue-looking whelps. Give honey and water rectally, blood warm, and apply artificial respiration. Rub briskly with warm cloths and lay the puppy on a warm heating pad. Nine times out of ten it will live.

Use one-half cup boiled water and one teaspoon strained honey. Honey and water is an easily assimilated quick source of energy. Increase or decrease the honey according to individual requirements of the puppy. No two are alike and it seems each requires a different feeding - some a bit more honey, some a bit less. Rectal feedings are given in much the same manner as oral feedings, a drop at a time, waiting approximately one-half minute between drops. I have found that 6 drops given hourly, or 3 drops each half hour, are about the correct amount for a day-old Pom puppy at each feeding. Gradually increase the amount as the pup grows older. This is round-the-clock feeding and would not be a sufficient amount if not fed day and night.

Measure out what you want for one feeding in a warm teaspoon. Allow an extra drop for the spoon and one for the dropper. Grease the tip, and only the tip, and insert it. Squeeze the bulb only enough to deliver the one drop at a time. Do not remove it unless there is not enough air in the bulb to move the fluid. Hold it there until the puppy is fed. Be extremely careful. It is not necessary to go high into the rectum. An inch is much too high! One-quarter inch is plenty, and one-eighth inch is even better. There will be a tiny amount of urine and you will have to stroke the puppy with cotton dipped in warm water. Nothing else will be evacuated after the first waxy substance of the very newborn, as long as you are feeding in this manner. I rely almost entirely on this method for quick results. Every single drop fed rectally seems to be utilized, and the puppy usually improves so rapidly that oral feedings can be started very quickly. Alternate beef extract feedings and honey and water if a puppy cannot tolerate milk, and some of them cannot.

Give only one drop of liver juice daily. As they get older you can give them a tiny ball of chopped liver. They will love it, but for goodness sake, don't overdo this liver bit. Never feed raw pork liver. Make the liver juice by chopping a small piece of beef liver and placing it on a warm saucer.

When there is juice or blood, draw up in a warm medicine dropper what is needed. It is well worth feeding that tiny amount. To make beef extract place small strips of lean beef in a fruit jar (absolutely no fat). Put the jar in a heavy pot and add enough cold water to come up to the level of the beef in the jar. (Do not put the water in the meat.) Simmer very slowly until juice is extracted. Do not dilute. Add nothing. Do not tighten lid on the jar.

My Pet formula (and I've raised all my teeny weenie ones on it) is one I'd hate to do without. I give it to you leaving out the cod liver oil and Vionate, and substitute Bemeco which you can get from your veterinarian. Vionate is wonderful but you have to crush it a bit finer and cod liver oil thickens the formula unless it is made fresh daily. Bemeco contains everything necessary and is terrific. If you wish to use Vionate and cod liver oil OK. Use one drop of oil and about one teaspoon of crushed Vionate. Add to 2 oz. of PET milk (not Carnation), 2 oz. boiled water, 1 coffee spoon Karo syrup, one egg yolk (strained so that not one speck of the indigestible white slips by). Mix thoroughly. The formula, the honey and water, and the beef extract can all be fed rectally, but usually the latter two are sufficient.

I can sum up the whys and wherefores of this rectal feeding business in very few words, with apologies to Lord Tennyson: Mine is not to question why,

I feed 'em this way else they die!





Genetics Made (sort of) Simple by Mary Allan

Introduction

"Genetics" is that branch of science that seeks to explain modes of inheritance. Its principles have been used, whether by fortune or design, in every branch of husbandry since man first started controlling his environment. A working knowledge of genetics requires the assimilation and correlation of three basic areas. I think of these as the what, the why, and the how. The what is the basic vocabulary of the discipline. The why is the mechanics whereby the end result is produced. The how is really the practical application of "why" - using your knowledge of the mechanics to construct your own blueprint for perfection.

PART ONE - THE VOCABULARY

Phenotype & Genotype

The first, and most important, point to remember is that what you see (the physical appearance, or phenotype) is not necessarily what you get (the genetic profile, or genotype). That is why "Mr. or Miss Top Winner" may never produce anything worth looking at, whilst the less spectacular littermate produces excellence time after time.

Genes; Chromosomes; Mitosis; Meiosis


The units of inheritance are referred to as "genes". They come in pairs (one donated by each parent) and are located on the chromosomes. These are found (also in pairs) in the nucleus of every cell. Each species has a specific number of chromosome pairs: the dog has 39, man 23, cat 19, etc. All the chromosomes (and thus the genes) of any one organism is the result of cellular duplication, termed mitosis, which started at fertilization. All the organism's genetic material is the same in all its cells with one exception: the mature primary reproductive cells or gametes. These are the sperm in the male and the ova in the female. These cells carry only half the number of chromosomes and thus half the number of genes. This is not a haphazard allotment. Each sperm or ovum receives one half of each pair in a reductive cellular division called meiosis, so that when it unites with its "opposite number" at fertilization there will again be a full genetic complement to act as a blueprint for the new organism that will result from this union.

Alleles; Homozygous & Heterozygous; Dominant & Recessive Genes

Any gene may have more than one alternative for the trait it produces (e.g. black/brown, tall/short). Each of these alternatives is termed an allele. When the two alleles present are identical the animal is said to be homozygous (or "pure") for that trait, and that animal is only able to pass on that form of the trait. When the two alleles are







- S Self color, or totally pigmented coat.
- sⁱ "Irish Spotting" small areas of white on chest & toes.
- sp Piebald spotting larger white areas (eg Springer Spaniel)
- s^W Extreme white mostly white, only small areas of pigment.

Note that S is dominant to all the other alleles; sⁱ is recessive to S but dominant to s^p and s^w; s^p is dominant only to s^w; and s^w is recessive to all the other alleles.

Incomplete Dominance

Most of the time the phenotype of the homozygous dominant and that of the heterozygous individual will be indistinguishable. Occasionally, however, the heterozygous animal will have a different phenotype from either the homozygous dominant or the homozygous recessive. This phenomenon is called incomplete dominance. This is easily illustrated in the Shetland Sheepdog. Dominant MM individuals are almost all white and frequently suffer from sight and hearing defects. Mm individuals are the dappled merles, whilst the double- recessive mm animals will show normal coat patterns and colors as determined by other color genes. This also points out the fallacy of the commonly held belief that all "good" genes are dominant, and "bad" ones recessive.

Monogenic & Polygenic Traits

Some traits, such as the chocolate color, are determined by a single gene and referred to as monogenic characters. Other characteristics, such as body size, are determined by many genes acting in unison. These traits are referred to as polygenic.

Modifying Genes

These genes seem to modify the expression of one allele in a gene series, but not the other. A good example is the B-b gene, responsible for black (B) or chocolate (b) pigmentation. Whereas there is very little variation in the intensity of black pigment, a wide spectrum can be seen in the chocolate varying from the darkest brown to a light taupe. This modification is polygenically controlled.

Threshold Characters

These characters are always polygenically controlled. They can be thought of as traits which require a certain number of "plus" polygenes to be present before the trait can be expressed.

Sex Linked and Sex Specific Traits

A sex linked trait is one that is carried on the X or the Y chromosome - those which determine the sex of the organism. An example of this is haemophilia. Carried on the X chromosome, this disease is carried recessively by the female, to become apparent in those of her sons that inherit that recessive X chromosome. Very rarely, a female will be affected as a result of a carrier mother and an affected father.

A sex specific trait is one carried on any gene other than the X or Y, (i.e. on an autosomal gene) but which can only find expression in one sex. A good example is cryptorchidism, the failure of one or both testicles to descend normally into the scrotum. If a single testicle descends whilst the other is retained the animal is unilaterally cryptorchid. "Monorchid" signifies that the animal has only one testicle - no matter where it is located. Obviously, only males can show these abnormalities, but the trait is carried by both sexes.

We continue to have good things to report concerning our effort to find answers about Alopecia X. As we have reported previously, the Pom community was most cooperative to donate DNA samples this past spring. Our number quota was accomplished. These samples were successfully received at the University of Bern, Switzerland, by Dr. Tosso Leeb.

A major step was achieved in order to do the next phase of DNA study. In late July, Dr. Leeb reported that the EU-LUPA steering committee has approved the genotyping of our Alopecia X cohort for the whole genome association study. He continued by saying, "This is indeed great news, and we all should be very grateful to the European Union, which supports this research very generously." This represents approximately \$40,000.00 worth of support. And without this amount approved, the total needed would have had slim possibilities to be able to be raised. In the first part of August, Dr. Leeb turned in an Acorn Grant request to the AKC-Canine Health Foundation, which the Pomeranian Charitable Trust has promised to support. When we receive the formal request from the AKC-CHF, we will need to provide the funds quickly. I am hoping that our donors see the necessity for raising and saving these funds so they can be put into immediate action when needed. Sometimes it seems as if "nothing is happening" during the beginning stages (which do take time) of putting these plans together. Should we not be able to provide funds at the appropriate time, the whole project is generally scrubbed in order to proceed with others. We form a piece or link of a chain.

For those of you who have donated DNA already and have updates to make on a particular Pom's medical condition, please contact Dr. Leeb's study directly by emailing Cord.Droegemueller@itz.unibe.ch This is particularly necessary for Poms that have been described as "unaffected" that have since become affected. Or there have been recent veterinary test results to report. Thank you for taking care of these details. Accuracy of data "in" is vital for informational discovery "out."

And we have started a new project. It is creating a photo file of Alopecia X Poms. I have requested that people send me clinical close-up photos (profiles, rear views, and possibly abdomens) of Poms affected with Alopecia X. They will be used for educational purposes. Some will be used on the PCT website. Others can be included in educational seminars. And, maybe the most important reason will be to be able to approach other researchers unfamiliar with Alopecia X to cultivate their interest and curiosity. Pictures should include a photo (in any position) before onset. A brief case medical history is definitely desirable. Please include the age of the Pom when the condition first onset; what veterinarian tests were performed, if any, along with their results; and what methods of recoating were attempted along with brief assessment of these.

Another interesting subset of these cases could include cases that have recoated either temporarily or permanently. In these cases, a "before onset of Alopecia X" picture should be included if possible, "affected" photos, and "recoated" photos. Of course, we would want the case descriptions to be similar to all other cases: onset age, medical tests performed, what methods of recoating, if any, failed, and what succeeded, and for how long.

Dr. Leeb, upon hearing of our Alopecia photo file, has requested that if I receive a photo of a Pom that was included in the DNA study at Bern, I forward a copy to him. Once again honoring confidentiality, the only way we could help with this is for you who have donated blood samples to voluntarily send us that information along with photos of that Pom. This request comes with the understanding that the more information we can give the researchers, the more likely we are to find answers to our questions.

Once again, I have been very pleased with the cooperation I have already received globally. I think we are all very tired of not having any true answers to what is going on with this condition. APC Judges' Education

I am writing this having just returned home from the Reliant Park cluster of dog shows in Houston. What a great venue for a super set of summer shows. It was very successful with over 3000 entries at most shows, even with the current gas prices. I presented our Pomeranian Judges Education Seminar at a Toy Dog Institute jointly sponsored by the American Kennel Club and the Dog Judges Association of America. Our session was extremely well-attended with 30 attendees. This was an Institute format, with a formal classroom session in the morning, followed by a "hands-on" class judging session in the afternoon. I want to thank Erika Moureau, who assisted me with this program and arranged for the dogs to come to both portions of the seminar. The Houston Pom exhibitors were terrific as well, volunteering to bring the dogs for us. We couldn't have been successful without their help.

By the time you read this, I will have also presented our program at the American Dog Show Judges Institute in Pennsylvania, with help from Carol Leemhuis and Camilla Knight. These two institutes provide a great opportunity to educate a large number of prospective judges interested in our breed.

The Mentor Committee has begun our work to review the APC Membership Roster and invite members that we unanimously agree are qualified to be officially listed as Approved Mentors. The committee will invite an initial list during 2008 and then perform a periodic review thereafter. The committee consists of Vikki Oelerich, Nadine Hersil, Curtiss Smith and myself.

Other APC members can still be approved as Mentors by meeting the minimum qualifications required by our Standing Rules. The Standing Rule that refers to Approved Mentor qualifications (Miscellaneous section, #37) reads as follows:

"APC Approved Mentor guidelines require that minimum qualifications are (a) the person must be an APC Member who is an active Pomeranian Breeder/Exhibitor for 12 years, (b) have bred 5 Pomeranian champions, (c) and have attended an APC sanctioned Mentor Seminar; (d) or be an AKC Approved Pomeranian Judge. Approved Mentors may also be invited to participate by the Mentor Committee from the APC membership list. APC Seminars will be presented by the JEC, or an Approved Mentor."

I have had a couple of emails recently that indicate there is some confusion about what the Approved Mentor program is for. It is strictly aimed at meeting the AKC requirement that Parent Clubs have qualified mentors available to help educate aspiring judges, specifically to meet the need for what are called "ringside observation" sessions where an aspiring judge sits ringside with an approved mentor and discusses the breed and the placements. The program has nothing to do with mentoring new owners and exhibitors on how to groom and show their Poms, or how to get started with responsible and ethical breeding practices. All members are welcome to do this if they are willing to, and APC appreciates their time and efforts. There are no formal requirements for helping new people interested in the breed.

We all rely on mentors to help us as "newbies" to the dog world. A good mentor is essential to the establishment of a successful breeding progam. A mentor can be someone who personally partners with you, or offers help and advice through a Q&A group such as this one.

A mentoring relationship should ideally provide benefits for both the mentor and the protege. Here are some of the elements involved in a successful mentoring relationship (from a business website):

- 1. COLLABORATIVE ~ WORKING ON A SHARED AGENDA
- 2. EXPECTANT OF GROWTH AND LEARNING FROM EACH OTHER
- 3. MUTUALLY SUPPORTIVE, CARING, AND RECIPROCAL
- 4. BASED ON A BELIEF THAT IT IS WORTH MAKING TIME TO CULTIVATE AND MAINTAIN THE RELATIONSHIP
- 5. POSITIVE, OPENNESS TO LEARNING, EACH RESPECTING THE DIGNITY OF THE OTHER & THE OTHER'S VIEW POINT
- 6. GOAL-ORIENTED AND PROBLEM-SOLVING FOCUSED
- 7. CONFIDENTIAL, PROMOTING A LOW-RISK CLIMATE FOR TRYING NEW IDEAS AND MAKING MISTAKES FOR THE SAKE OF LEARNING
- 8. DEVELOPMENTAL, EVOLVING AND CHANGING OVER TIME AS THEY EACH GROW PROFESSIONALLY
- 9. OPEN TO INFORMAL MENTORING & ASSISTANCE FROM OTHER COLLEAGUES OUTSIDE OF THE FORMAL MENTOR-PROTEGE PAIR
- 10. PROFESSIONAL, ORIENTED TO CONTINUALLY IMPROVING THEIR PRACTICE, SKILLS, ANALYTICAL ABILITIES, AND RESULTS
- 11. REFLECTIVE, SELF-ASSESSING, ANALYZING & EVALUATING & CHECKING THEIR OWN ASSUMPTIONS



I'd like to give instructions for teaching your dog to come when called, and will illustrate the need with a story about my adopted rescue Pom, Crickett (now 7 months old). Twice last month she got out the front door, once when I accidentally "let" her out, and once when one of my granddaughters did. Both times she ran as fast as she could, and paid no attention to my voice, which she considered "noise" behind her. The first time was when my neighbors were putting up a new fence, and there was NO fence between Crickett and busy Yaupon Street. The second time, my neighbor was backing down the driveway, and Crickett ran right behind the car. I was shouting "NO, NO, NO" and waving my arms, and luckily my

Both times, when I did catch Crickett, I carried her inside, praising her, and fed her multiple people-treats from the refrigerator to induce her to WANT to come back or be caught another time.

By way of management, we put a baby gate across the hallway whenever Crickett was loose.


We then started playing "Come Games" with Crickett. One person holds the dog's collar, while another teases her with the treat in front of her nose, saying her name and backing up. "Crickett, Crickett, Crickett, Crickett, Crickett COME!" When the word "come" is said, the first person releases the collar. Crickett runs to the treat and gets to nibble it while the second person takes hold of the collar. (It's important to have the dog think that getting "caught" is required for getting the treat.) Then the two people reverse roles. This should be done no more than 3-4 times about 3 times a day. Treats must be of major importance—tiny pieces of chicken or hamburger are great.

The next week illustrated the success of this training. Someone came to the door, and I did not know that one of my granddaughters had let Crickett out of her crate. She charged out the door and took off. I called, "Crickett, COME!" She turned on a dime, raced back, and was carried rejoicing to the refrigerator where she got multiple pieces of hamburger. AND the baby gate was put up again. It will stay there as long as my granddaughters are here, even though when I know Crickett is loose I am able to say "Wait" and have her stay back from the door. Without the "Wait," she does not yet have impulse control.

Sidelight: At the Reliant Dog Shows in Houston on July 19, I applied for Crickett's PAL (Purebred Alternative Listing) number from the AKC, and it arrived in the mail less than 2 weeks later. She is now officially "Second Chance Jumpin' Jimminy." It was fun to watch the people at the AKC booth taking

BEHIND THE RALLY CLIPBOARD

I love to judge Rally (and also Obedience, which I judge for UKC). Watching the teamwork between dogs and handlers gives me so much joy that sometimes I forget that one thing I'm supposed to be doing is JUDGING. Taking off points for errors on the part of the dog or handler is just not as much fun as watching them work! For that reason, I am presenting you with one of the easiest ways to avoid making the judge sigh and take off points in Rally:

Read the regulations. There are certain things that YOU can do (not your well-trained dog) that will cost you points or even a Non-Qualifying score. The new Regulations include in the description of each exercise highlighted (bold, underlined) portions that if they are not done should cause you to receive an Incorrect Performance score (-10) for that exercise. Note for example that on EVERY walk-around exercise, a pause in heel position is required. Watch the judge's pencil fly when someone walks around and keeps going.

There is a line that everyone should keep in mind in the "AKC Rally Introduction": "Any faults in traditional AKC Obedience that would be evaluated and scored as a one-point deduction or more should be scored the same in rally, unless otherwise mentioned in the <u>Rally Regulations</u>." This means that your dog will lose points for being out of heel position between exercises, not just during exercises. But it allows for the "unlimited communication" in the way of commands and signals because that is specified in the Rally Regulations.

Whenever the Rally Regulations do not address a subject, the Obedience Regulations take over. This is true when it comes to things like correcting (a leash pop or collar tug) or carrying your dog in the ring at any time, even before and after the Start and Finish. I am always amazed at how many people will push the dog into a sit at the Start sign. And yes, even if your dog has bladder problems, incontinence in the ring is still "fouling the ring" and will get you Excused. (Yes, someone has tried to use that as an excuse!)

And what about the collar and leash? The biggest issue with the collar is the dog who comes into the ring from Agility with a one-pieced "martingale" collar/leash. Your dog must wear a collar that can be separated from its leash, even when you are in the Novice ring, and may not "run naked" in Advanced or Excellent. On the other hand, you cannot have tags attached/dangling from the collar. Most judges will tell you to get a proper collar and come back, and you can only hope that by the time you get back, your class will not be over. In the Excellent class, the handler must provide a 6-foot leash for the Honor exercise. I was the Honor Steward at a recent trial and could not believe how many exhibitors came without this required part of their performance. We managed to borrow a 6-foot leash from another exhibitor, but can you imagine someone entering the Utility ring without having provided the articles or gloves for those exercises? Or Open without a dumbbell?

Need help understanding Rally or Obedience? Volunteer to steward at a trial near you. This is a sure-fire method of learning the ropes (literally, if it's an outdoor trial!). At the simplest, you can offer to "run" the leash in Rally Advanced or Excellent, taking it from the handler and returning it after the course is run. That will also help you keep in mind the importance of everyone entering and leaving the ring on leash.

Help with course setup. Run the stopwatch. And watch the dogs in the ring. If you see a mistake made by someone else, it may help you avoid the same mistake. And if you are lucky enough to see one of those beautiful hold-your-breath runs, you will have a goal toward which to aim.



2008 World Dog Show

A World of Poms! By Chris Heartz, Photos by John Heartz

We decided to join a tour (Fresh Pond) going to the World dog show in Sweden this summer, see some of the best Poms from Europe and meet up with a few other Pom people who planned to do the same thing. Only Crufts could compare in size and professionalism to the World Show and this is the crown jewel in the FCI Dog Show world.

The size of the World Show was amazing! More than 20,000 dogs over 4 days in a huge complex of 4 buildings, with 342 different breeds from 57 countries in more than 70 rings each day. In conjunction with the World Show, Breed and Specialty clubs held their own shows and specialties outdoors, during the same 4 days, Circuit at the Almare Staket Polo field outside of Stockholm. So this gave Exhibitors and spectators a chance to see their breed at least twice, over the four days of shows as judging of the breeds were not on the same days. Poms were on outside on Saturday at the Circuit Show and indoors the next day at the World Show.

Poms are in Group 5 which is the Spitz Group and today Poms were part of the Swedish Spitz Club World Championship Show and Best In Specialty (Spitz) to be judged by fellow Canadian, Mr. Fred Peddie. There is really no room to explain the differences in the judging systems here, but I have listed the winners of the classes and the sires and dams as that is interesting, you will recognize many names.

The quality of the entry, both Saturday at the outdoor show and the next day at the indoor World Show was excellent. There was nice depth of quality in every class and a variety of types. There were several dogs in each class worthy of the win. It was exciting to see so Canadian and American bloodlines being continued in Europe.

The dogs were very well presented, though some of the trimming might have been considered a bit excessive for North America, but that was balanced by some dogs that would have benefited from a bit more trimming. Outdoors, of course Poms are not always at their best. It was windy and in Europe they enforce the "foreign substance" rule much more than in North America. There was no hairspray at all used in the coats that I could see.

The entry was on Saturday was 71 Poms and the judge was our good friend Dr. Apiwut Kasemsanta, (Pak Dome Pomeranians, of Bangkok, Thailand) My comments are, of course generalized, as we were watching the dogs from ringside, and as you know, decisions are often based on what you can't see from that vantage point.







Children Puppies

They just seem to go together. We all have childhood memories of our pets. If visiting a friend with a new puppy, what is the best policy for assuring both the child, and the pet, have a positive experience?

Puppies usually enter a household at the age of eight weeks. If the puppy is purchased from a responsible breeder, it will be current on inoculations, worming, and socialization. However, your child's interaction with a new puppy can encourage desired behavior. A bad experience for the puppy may trigger adverse reactions that will follow it the rest of its life. It is our responsibility to make sure we approach the puppy in a positive manner.

- 1. Puppies this age require handling with care. It is YOUR puppy, so YOU set the rules. Have children sit on the floor when they hold your puppy. Young canines have little "depth perception" and few reservations about "sailing" off a lap into the unknown. This can result in broken limbs and possible death. Do not place puppies on tables or couches, on chairs, in wagons or bicycle baskets.
- 2. DO NOT PAT THE PUPPY ON TOP OF ITS HEAD! Have the child scratch the puppy under the chin or behind the ears, or gently pat the body.
- 3. Children should not kiss puppies or place their faces near the puppy's mouth.
- 4. Puppies, "user friendly", have sharp toenails. Dress accordingly.
- 5. NEVER ALLOW ANYONE TO CHASE YOUR PET. NEVER ALLOW YOUR PET TO RUN WITH CHILDREN AS THEY ARE EASILY STEPPED ON AND INJURED.
- 6. Puppies view people as large, threatening boxes in a world made up of shoes and knees. KNEEL DOWN ON THEIR LEVEL.
- 7. Never allow anyone to feed your pet without your knowledge and authorization.

- 8. Loud noises threaten puppies, so encourage moderate tones. Do not allow jostling or tussling among children when the puppy is present.
- 9. Playtime should be short, as puppies require lots of sleep. Do not feel obligated to allow others to over tire or stimulate your pet.
- 10. Make acceptable toys available to the child and pet.

Always remember, an "out of sight" puppy is often a puppy in trouble. The "formative period" is four weeks to four months. Desirable behavior should be encouraged during this "door of opportunity". Use positive stimulation, rewards, and exposure. Keep your puppy in a designated area to encourage housebreaking techniques. Feed at specific times to control bowel habits.

When you are gone, confine your puppy with safe toys and a treat. Turning on a radio or TV for company cuts back on fearful behavior,

In recognition of this milestone, the AKC will waive the invitational format. As was the case for AKC's centennial show in 1984, classes will be offered at the breed level and championship points will be awarded.



The event will take place in Long Beach, CA on Saturday, December 12 and Sunday, December 13, 2009 and will continue to showcase the top American dogs as well as offer the popular Bred-by-Exhibitor competition and Eukanuba World Challenge. AKC anticipates a very significant entry and therefore an entry limit may be necessary. The panel for this show will consist of almost 90 judges.

To further commemorate the anniversary, AKC Parent Clubs are invited to hold a specialty or supported entry in conjunction with this show. If a Parent Club chooses not to participate, then local specialty clubs will be given the opportunity to join us. The AKC/Eukanuba National Championship will return to an invitation-only format in 2010. All dogs who would have qualified for the 2009 show will be invited to attend the 2010 show, along with the 2010 qualifiers.

The AKC National Obedience Invitational and AKC Agility Invitational will be held in conjunction with the 2009 AKC/Eukanuba National Championship. The Los Encinos Kennel Club, Kennel Club of Beverly Hills and Long Beach Kennel Club shows will precede the AKC/Eukanuba National Championship at the same site on Dec. 9-11, 2009.

excessive barking, and anxieties. Place an old T-shirt or personal item in the crate for your puppy.

Puppies require patience and care, and if your time is restricted, wait until a later time to purchase a puppy.

A soothing voice builds confidence in adverse situations. Your dog will imitate your emotional response, so remain calm and confident. Establish yourself as alpha.

Puppies need proper stimulation because boredom leads to problems. Chewing is normal for puppies. Give them appropriate articles to chew on during teething. HUMAN ARTICLES OF CLOTHING AND SHOES LEFT ON THE FLOOR ARE "FAIR GAME". DO NOT CORRECT THE PUPPY FOR YOUR SHORTCOMINGS. Take your puppy to another location and give it an acceptable replacement.

Do not leave tin cans, bottles, buckets, scissors, paper clips, or other small items where your puppy can reach them. Remove access to all human food.

Visiting humane societies and assisting in small chores is an excellent experience for young children. PARENTAL SUPERVISION IS REQUIRED. Shelter employees ARE NOT babysitters! Teach children to be respectful of the dog's space and to follow directions to insure a positive experience.

Every child needs a pet. Through caring for a pet, children learn responsibility. Dogs offer companionship through play and activities as well as comfort during thoughtful times. Owning or playing with puppies builds happy memories. Lassie and Rin Tin Tin remain ageless and fill the corners of our completeness. Dogs expect kindness and hold no grudges. We should not disappoint them.
