ATTENTION: JUDGES PLEASE READ

The Board of Directors of the American Pomeranian Club respectfully requests that you take note of the following information.

The official standard that was approved by the American Pomeranian Club membership and the American Kennel Club in 1997 makes this statement with regard to the eyes of the Pomeranian.

“The eyes are dark, bright, medium in size and almond-shaped.”

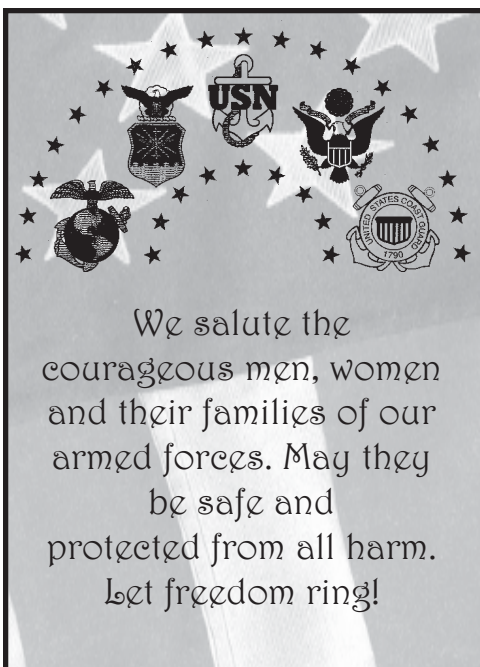
It has been brought to the attention of the Board that there is a movement underway to show and win championship points on animals that have eyes that are blue and/or green in color. These colors are not “dark”. Dogs/bitches that have blue or green eyes are not acceptable and should be penalized to the point of eliminating them from competition. At no time since the breed was introduced in America before 1900 and approved for competition has the eye been any color other than dark brown.

We wish to encourage breeders to breed to the standard and concentrate on correcting faults that are clearly stated rather than introducing factors that are in direct opposition to what is already approved. While this is not a **DISQUALIFICATION**, you cannot eliminate such dogs on that principle; however, ribbons can be withheld for lack of merit, or simply place those dogs out of the ribbons.

I neglected to publicly thank them at the banquet for their continued generous support to our health foundation. Pomeranians everywhere thank them! Our Hawaiian friends, who cannot pack their Poms bring their warm graciousness, beautiful leis, and a variety of macadamia nuts! But we also are glad to add Puerto Rico, England, Thailand, and South Africa to our guest list this year.

The rest of this Review issue will encapsulate the 2005 memories. I personally let the artwork symbolize all three days' worth of memories and these beautiful prints also help differentiate it from other past Nationals. But I'm sure you each have your own highlight to recall. I don't want to ever forget someone confusing Tony's greeting of "Que pasa?" with the Polish sausage "kilbasa." Or the snow-covered walk to "Meet & Greet" hospitality night. It was just perfect packed into snowballs.

If you were unable to attend, you still have a chance to view some of the beautiful Poms in competition by ordering a DVD of the WD, WB, and BOB classes. See the order form in this issue, or use the one available through the APC web site. And the beautiful artwork prints are also still available in this same way.

While we are still unpacking, the plans for next year are well underway. First, mark your calendars and start your own travel plans to join us for the next National Specialty. We have booked the same hotel in Louisville for March 13, 14, and 15, 2006.

Mr. Stefano Scullino has agreed to donate another piece of his beautiful Pomeranian artwork to be the Specialty logo. During the year, we will be accepting artwork entries for upcoming years' logos. These will be displayed at the 2006 National and the winners chosen and announced there. (See more details in this issue.) In recognition of past years' Specialty logos and to benefit the Pomeranian Charitable Trust alopecia fund, Anne Berryman will make a quilt using donated material artwork which will be raffled off and winner drawn at the National. (More details appear in this issue.)

The APC voted to endorse CERF testing. APC will work with CHIC (Canine Health Information Center) for this open registry. Once again, more detailed information will follow once this link has been established with CHIC. But to help emphasize this effort, we will try to arrange an ophthalmology educational seminar and screening possibility during the National.

The Rally Seminar was well-received this year. Next year's show committee will try to incorporate a Rally trial, complementing the Obedience trial.

And there's one more new exciting addition we are planning. Have you heard about a Top Twenty Competition? Other breeds have done this to help raise funds and also help document part of breed history. Generally, the Top Twenty in Breed points are invited to enter. (This can be expanded to include any BIS or BISS winner that year.) Handlers and viewers dress up for this special occasion. Dogs enter the ring one at a time while their win history is read, similar to the Parade of Champions. There is a panel of respected judges: one a breeder, one a handler, and one an AKC judge. The dogs are scored according to an assigned point scale and their scores combined. They are moved in every possible direction for all viewers to see and so that a DVD can be made of each. More time is spent with each entrant than the normal BOB competition allows. So viewers really get a chance to see these dogs they might not otherwise see in person. The DVD becomes part of our breed history and, of course, available for fanciers of the breed to study. The winner is not announced until the Awards Night at the banquet. The score sheets are given to the owners, or chosen delegate, and it is their option to post them.

Hope I have you looking forward to attending the 2006 National. With the responsibility of our main chairs filled, I'm sure they would appreciate your contacting them to assist in any way you can.

Ask Us Anything

Our question for this issue is: Is there anything that can be done to help save a fading puppy?

Fading puppies are one of the biggest mysteries and certainly one of the saddest heartbreaks that toy breeders can experience. Some puppies have problems thriving from birth, and some begin to decline at several weeks old. For the purposes of this article, I will include suggestions for all puppies that are failing to thrive, whether it be from birth or at several weeks old. When autopsies are performed on fading puppies that have died, more often than not, no apparent cause for death can be found. Occasionally, causative factors such as a cleft pallet, congenital heart defect, liver disease, or infection can be pinpointed as the cause for death.

In cases such as congenital heart defect, there is obviously nothing that could have been done to save the puppy. On the other hand, if the puppy was simply lacking nutrition, action could have been taken in an attempt to save the puppy. For unknown reasons, fading puppies often lack the vigor to nurse properly and die of malnutrition. In our own breeding program, I have been successful about half of the time by supplementing nutrition and electrolytes to fading puppies. Yes, these are not great odds, but for the puppies that do make it, I feel that the effort is well worth it. I also keep the puppies on light heat and keep the humidity levels up in the room where they are located.

I have observed that puppies that are failing to thrive do not digest formula well. Every time I've tried to supplement formula to a weak or failing puppy, I have lost that puppy. The formula apparently places added strain on the puppy's already weakened system. I have used formula quite successfully on strong puppies whose mothers simply don't have enough milk for them. This is a different situation than supplementing a puppy whose system is not working properly. I have been quite successful using a mixture of Dyne and unflavored Pedialyte. Dyne is available from most veterinary supply catalogues. I would never want to whelp a litter of Poms without having it on hand. Pedialyte can be purchased from any grocery store. I use 1 part Dyne to 2 parts Pedialyte. Mix this together and it will form a milky looking emulsion. (Resorb can be substituted for Pedialyte. This is handy to store because it comes in small packets of powder that you can mix with water, as you need it.) Warm the portion of the Dyne/Pedialyte mixture that you will be feeding to wrist temperature and then add a tiny pinch of acidophilus powder. Refrigerate the balance. Feed 1 cc every 2 hours for a 3-4 oz. puppy. I generally tube feed this mixture. When the puppy begins to gain weight and strength, you can skip the middle of the night feeding. After a few days, the puppy will often begin to improve dramatically and begin to nurse once again on its dam. If the dam has no milk, you can gradually phase back in your selected formula (I prefer fresh, clean goat's milk to formula when available). Watch the stools closely to be sure that the formula is being digested. If the stool has a lot of curds in it, then you will need to go back to the Dyne mixture until the digestive system is able to cope with the formula.

I do not like to give antibiotics, but sometimes they are the only option in a life-threatening situation. If a bacterial infection is suspected, I also give amoxicillin to the puppy twice a day for seven days. Amoxicillin will damage the beneficial intestinal flora, so it is important to give a Probiotic supplement to the puppy. If you think that your puppy would benefit from antibiotic therapy, consult your veterinarian. Do not overdose the antibiotics. For a tiny puppy, only one drop per dose is required.

We would like to congratulate Bonnie Harris on her feature this month. It was a pleasure meeting you in Kentucky and rooming next to you and Joan. Let's do it again next year! We wish you continued success!

Ask Us Anything Continued

If your puppy reaches 4 weeks old and still needs additional nutrition, you will likely be able to feed it from a dish. By 5 weeks, almost all puppies can eat from a dish. If the puppy is digesting well, I prepare the following mixture and feed it from a dish several times a day:

- 1 Tablespoon Powdered Premium Puppy food (you can powder the kibble in a blender) or Gerber Baby Rice Cereal if the pup is not yet ready for food
- 1 teaspoon liver puree
- 1 Tablespoon Goat's Milk or plain Yogurt
- 1 cc Dyne
- a pinch of Probiotic powder
- Enough water to make a gruel that your puppy can easily eat.

If the puppy is not digesting well, give the Dyne/Pedialyte mixture only for a day or two, then gradually phase food back in as it is tolerated. As the puppy gets older, cut back this mixture, and phase in the puppy food of your choice. If you lose your puppy, try not to be too heartbroken. (I know; easier said than done!) It's heart-wrenching to lose puppies that you have tried to save. Feel some comfort in knowing that you tried your best. Some puppies just seem "not meant to be" or have a serious health problem that could not have been helped no matter what efforts were made to save them.

Our question for the next issue is: What are probiotics?

Board Meeting March 13, 2005

The meeting was called to order by President Marge Kranzfelder at 2:05 P. M.

Those present were Sally Baugnet, Cindy Boulware, Diana Downey, Jane Lehtinen, Alane Levinsohn, Margaret McKee, Erika Moureau, Janice Russell, Fran Stoll and Gregg Waters. Guests present were Walda Green, Brenda Segelken, Cheri McDonald, and Donna Riehm.

The reading of minutes from the last meeting were dispensed and approved as written in the 2004 Roster. Treasurer, Erika Moureau reported a year-end profit of \$16,090.77, with total income of \$107,430.35 and total expense of \$91,339.58. The proposed operating budget for June 2005 through May 2006 was presented.

Report of Committees:

Ways & Means - Donna Riehm presented her 2004 report with total sales of \$11,915.50. Walda Green said she still needed volunteers for the booth and there are 50 color prints and 33 black and white prints of the Stefano Scullino artwork for sale.

Historian - Cindy Boulware reported that "Parker", Ch Pufpride Sweet Dreams has 41 BIS with the record being 43 held by Ch. Lennis' Tar Lacy Foxfire.

Breeder Referral, Jane Lehtinen had nothing to report. All going fine was the report from Diana Downey on Rescue and from membership, Annette Davis.

Marge Kranzfelder presented information from Darrell Baker, our APC Delegate.

Judges Education - Dot Martin would like new judges manuals made as the present need updated. She would also like the Judges seminars locations posted on the web site.

Historical Awards - Carol Leehmuis after much thought recommended that we leave the Agility Hall of Fame as is and change the Gold Club to be Master Agility Champion (MACH) in place of the MX title.

Web site - Diana Downey reported 2 graphic links sold on the members list. She would like to look into securing the site for entries and purchases in the future.

Link Check - reported by Janice Russell that there are two sites not in compliance and the link from APC site will be broken.

Pom Charitable Trust - reported by Marge Kranzfelder that the University of Missouri needs a better check and balance system. Janice Russell talked with Dr. Linda Frank, University Of Tennessee who reported over 50% of those in the study have had all biopsy/samples completed and the samples will be studied over the summer.

Review - Brenda Segelken said she has no way to know how the review is doing on a monthly basis. The treasurer will send the Review information to Brenda on a monthly basis and Cheri McDonald will copy Brenda on the subscriptions information submitted to the treasurer. Regional Club reporters are needed to send information in from the local clubs.

Subscriptions - Cheri McDonald advised there has been an increase in subscription over the past year with the highest increase in bulk mail and foreign mail being down the last few months.

I have been judging since 1973. After twenty years of exhibiting, twelve of those years as a professional handler, I was approved to judge Pomeranians. I chose to become a judge in order to give back to the sport some of the knowledge I had gained from experience.

During my tenure as a professional handler, I became acquainted with many breeds, too many to list here. We owned and bred Poms, Pugs, Pekingese, Longhaired Dachshunds, and Brittanys. Our original breed was Pomeranians, and we showed several to their championship.

We were a small kennel and did a limited amount of breeding, striving to attain quality rather than quantity. Our homebred Ch. Marbilea's Gay Cinderella was a multi Group and an all breed Best In Show winner. She was BOB at the Chicago Pomeranian Specialty for five consecutive years. She won her last group at the ripe old age of eight years. At that time, she was considered the top winning Pom bitch of all time. Her record has been exceeded many times since.

It is great to see the accomplishments of the breeders in their efforts to improve the breed, meet the new breeders and exhibitors, and see old friends who are still active in the sport.

As a judge, I expect and demand that exhibitors behave as ladies and gentlemen and exhibit good sportsmanship. I expect that their animals be properly groomed and clean. I realize that everyone is not as proficient as the professional groomer and try never to penalize a novice due to their inexperience in trimming and grooming. I try to find time to suggest ways they can improve their exhibit by improving their grooming skills.

Train your dog before taking them to the show. Talk to the experienced exhibitor, be they amateur or professional, ask questions and practice. I would not want you to see some of our brood bitches, who would never be shown, looked like when I was learning to trim. Attend handling classes and fun matches if they are available.

In general, I feel that the quality of Poms has improved in recent years. There are a lot of good ones out there today and some dedicated breeders who are making great effort to improve the breed. However I would like to see more attention given to improving gait and quality of coat. There are too many soft coats.

I am well-satisfied with the standard as written. Please, breed to the standard and do not try to change it to suit what you are breeding.

I am now approved to judge Toy, Sporting, and Non-Sporting. During my tenure as a professional handler, I had many thrilling experiences. There are two that stand out in my mind. I was privileged to award championship points to the first parti-colored Pom bitch on record. The other was to finish the first and, to my knowledge, only salt and pepper, drop eared, Giant Schnauzer bitch on record.

I have judged in almost every state in the United States, Taiwan, several South American countries numerous times, as well as Puerto Rico and the Dominican Republic several times. I was honored when Sari Tietjen wrote The New Pomeranian and asked me to write the chapter on trimming the Pomeranian.

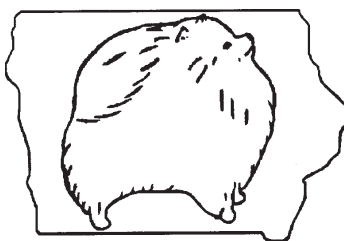

APC Critique - March 15 & 16, 2005



FRED C. BASSETT

Judging the National Specialty is the greatest honor that a breeder-judge can have, so it was my great pleasure to be honored by this invitation for the second time this year. Everything about the show was really special, and I congratulate the show committee and APC Board for putting on this memorable event. My personal thanks to Show Chairman Diana Downey, Show Secretary Cindy Boulware, Hospitality Chair Kelly Reimschissel, Club President Marge Kranzfelder, and Stewards Erika Moureau and Sally Baugniet for making it extra special for me.

My first task was to judge Junior Showmanship, and six talented Juniors made that a fun way to start the morning. Congratulations to Emily Hussey who was Best Junior, and did an excellent job.

The breed entry was very large, and the quality was exceptionally deep in both dogs and bitches. Sweepstakes judge Chris Hartz and I both agreed that we couldn't remember another specialty where there had been quality young dogs of such high numbers. The puppy classes were absolutely gorgeous, and speak well for the bright future of our breed. I had wonderful dogs of excellent quality in most classes, and was able to select dogs that consistently fit the make and shape that I look for. The problem spots that I found are the same as they have been for many years - bite problems, ear set and size, and poor tail sets. All of these still need some focus, but should not detract from the overall strength of the breed at this time. Breeders should be very proud of the fine job that has been done to bring the breed back to its current prominence.

The Best of Breed competition was truly breathtaking. The winners and Award of Merits will be named elsewhere, but I want to also list the dogs that were included in my first cut. Ch. Char's For Love Or Money, Ch. Patricia's Golden Bee, Ch. Idlewyld Precious Gem, Ch. Finch's Char's Spellbound Parti, and Ch. Jan-Shar's Daddy Says I'm Darling. They were all beautiful, and pushed the others hard for final placements.

I found when I marked my catalog that the Best of Breed dog, the Best of Winners Bitch and the Winners Dog were all out of the same sire and dam, with the Winners Dog and Bitch being litter mates from a repeat breeding. What a powerful combination! It was also a treat to see the gorgeous Best of Opposite bitch, who is from Thailand and speaks well of the quality breeding going on there.

I made one serious oversight at the Specialty, which I want to mention here and do my best to rectify. Somehow during the examination of the Dog Specials I failed to include Parker in the group of dogs that I cut to be included for final consideration in Best of Breed judging. There were a large number of dogs in the ring, and I chose to keep them all in while doing my individual examinations and making the cut which made for crowded conditions. After I had examined the Bitch Specials and made my cut there, and brought the Dogs and Bitches back together I noticed that Parker was missing. My Steward had advised me of a couple of dogs that left the ring sick during Best of Breed judging, so I assumed that Parker had been one of them. It wasn't until I was marking my catalog on the flight home that I realized that I must have inadvertently excused him. I certainly regret this, and wish I could "turn back the clock" to correct the situation. Of course I can't, so I want to pay tribute to Parker here as a small way to correct this oversight.

I mentioned at the banquet during my comments that these are exciting times for Pomeranians. We have a couple of exceptional dogs out right now that are making everyone take notice of the breed. Parker is one of the dogs that I was referring to. I classify dogs in my mind when I judge in categories of Excellent, Very Good, Good and Fair. I save a special Exceptional category for dogs that are beyond excellent, and are among the best that I have seen in the 40+ years that I have been involved with the breed. Parker and Luther are the two dogs that in my opinion fit this category at the present time. We don't always have a living dog that fits this category, and I believe we are very fortunate to have these two dogs with us now. Parker is not only Exceptional to look at, but has also proven himself to be equally valuable as a sire. It is a fitting testimony to this rare and valuable dog that the Best of Breed winner Luther, the Best of Winners bitch, and the Winners Dog were all sired by him. Parker also sired other class winners and placements. I want to compliment Parker's breeder Virginia Dimick, and his owners Nobel Inglett and Diane Finch for their accomplishments, and thank them for allowing the Pomeranian fancy to benefit from his tremendous value to the gene pool of the breed.

Parker and Luther could stand proudly next to the other Poms that I have considered Exceptional during my judging career, and admired from our breed history. These include Prince (Ch. Great Elms Prince Charming II), Duke (Ch. Corns Duke Dragonfly), Ch. Bonner's Stylepepper Preshus, some of the best Hadleigh's of the 60's, Ch. Aristic Wee Pepper Pod, and Ch. Sealand Moneybox.

Thanks again to the Show Committee and APC Board for giving us this great specialty show, and my personal thanks to all of the exhibitors for entering your beautiful Poms under me.

Sweepstakes Judge's Critique *Chris Heartz*



It was my pleasure to judge an amazing group of puppies at this year's American Pomeranian Club Sweepstakes. The depth of quality in several of the classes made me glad to be doing this task rather than competing against this outstanding group of puppies. Those who made it to my cuts, pleased me over all. Then it became a matter of determining the breed details each excelled in and what qualities were more important to me.

I was looking for a balanced puppy with adequate bone and coat, moderate, not over done. A puppy with a compact body that moved soundly, coming and going and one that could hold that shape moving around the ring. My class winners pleased me over all without any glaring faults. Final decisions were based on rewarding those who excelled in the details. The deciding factors were sometimes splitting hairs. It may have been coat texture, eye shape, a more balanced head, a well-set neck, slightly better coming or going. Top marks went for more of those things in one package.

I was pleased to see big improvements in soundness. There were a lot more balanced dogs that were good coming and going than in previous years. I was pleased to see lots of big, white teeth, as this is important in our breed. But I did see a few undershot bites, this is something to work on. Coats too, were harsher, better quality than in the past. I also saw more dogs with smaller, better set ears. While there were some good tail sets, I penalized those dogs, whose tail sets were low, because again, it's something that we need to be mindful of. In short, teeth and bites, coat texture and tail sets, all important basics to get right, then we can work on the details.

In all, it was a fabulous day and I thank you all for bringing me such wonderful puppies.

Thank you also to Kelly, Erica and Sally. You made my job easier. Thanks to the members of APC for asking me to judge, and for the lovely stained glass Pom, which was my gift. Thank you also to the Pomeranian Club of Hawaii for beautiful purple orchid lei.

STARFIRE'S GO GO DANCER - This clear orange bitch was so pretty! She held her outline moving and had a front that is hard to find in this breed. Her feminine head, beautifully shaped eye and soft expression just added to the picture. She had all this in an ideal sized package.

Whether you were new to or expanding your basic perceptions of alternative/holistic veterinary medicine, the APC provided an interesting and informative seminar for the National's participants.

Alternative/holistic medicine is no longer separate from traditional or conventional medicine, neither in humans nor in animals. Alternative/holistic medicine is about complementing traditional practices and finding alternatives where appropriate.

Our lecturer, Mark P. Haverkos, DVM, is a practicing veterinarian who specializes in alternative/holistic treatments such as chiropractic, acupuncture and herbal prescriptions in Oldenburg, Ind. Dr. Haverkos is a graduate of Ohio State University College of Veterinary Medicine. He spent several years as Head Clinician at the Hopi Veterinary Services in Northeastern Arizona. During Dr. Haverkos, tenure at the reservation, he spent in-depth study time with the tribal medicine men learning treatments and herbal remedies using American herbs.

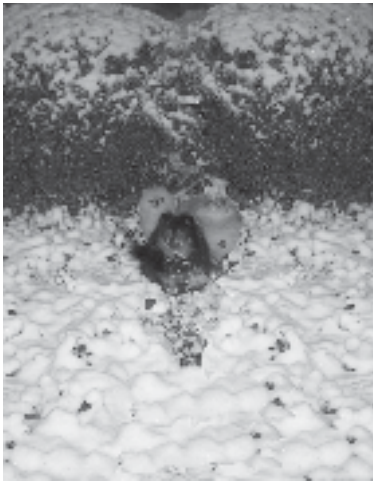
Holistic medicine, (w) holistic in practice, is to take a whole picture of the patient. Dr. Haverkos stresses that you evaluate from genetics, nutrition, family relationships, hygiene, and stress factors to find "root causes" of an illness. Upon diagnosis, it is the hope to prescribe the most efficacious, most cost affective, least invasive, least harmful treatment for the individual. Dr. Haverkos reminds us that this practice is in partnership with traditional practices you may be more familiar with.

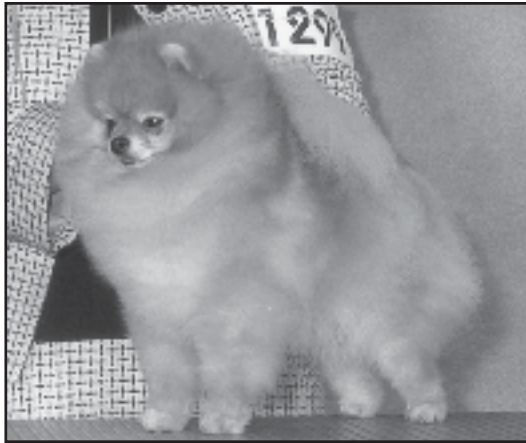

Letter to the Editor

Dear Pom Review,

I would like to correct an oversight in the Jan-Shar kennel visit from the last issue. There are several different ways to calculate the rankings of dogs, so I'll cover both systems and the APC system. First is by breed totals, which ranks dogs by the number of Pomeranians that they have defeated over the course of the year. In 2001, Ch. Jan-Shars Dudly Doright is listed as #1, having defeated 865 Poms. He also won the Pedigree Award that year for this victory. The other method of calculating the #1 dog is by all breed totals. This means that every dog of every breed that was defeated is counted. In this category, Ch. Sirius It's All About Me was the winner with 11,937 dog defeated and five Bests In Show that year. Ch. Jan-Shars Dudly Doright was a close second with 11,837 dogs defeated and four Bests In Show.

APC gives their awards to dogs whose owners are APC members, so Ch Jan-Shars Dudly Doright received the APC #1 dog based on his all breed wins, since Ch. Sirius It's All About Me's owner was not an APC member and was not in consideration for that award. That year Ch. Jan-Shars Daddy Says I'm Darling was the #1 bitch and was #6 overall in All Breed totals with 2,957 dogs defeated and in Breed competition was #8 with 519 Pomeranians defeated.

For any one breeder to have multiple dogs ranking so high is quite an honor and certainly a credit to their breeding program.

The APC Obedience Trial was held on Wednesday night. Let's get right to the most spectacular performance of the night, which came out of Novice A. For those of you who don't know about obedience, Novice A can be entered only by someone who has never before put an AKC Obedience title on any dog, and the dog may not be owned or co-owned by someone who has put an AKC Obedience title on any dog. Our High in Trial winner, with a score of 194 1/2, came from the Novice A class: Sunpom's Kodiak Moment, owned by Angela Patchen. I had hoped to have a story from Angela to put into this column, but since she has not yet contacted me, I can just tell you that when I asked her why she got into Obedience, she said that it was because this dog was totally unmanageable. He was a shining star. When I saw Angela's first heeling steps with him, I could tell this was going to be a memorable performance, and they didn't let me down. This team should be heard from more in the future.

Other classes: There were no qualifiers in Utility B. For some reason, the Bar Jump attracted most of the dogs, so they would go out over it, or come back over it when sent to the High Jump—or even both! Winner of the Open B class was Wendy Donnelly's Tiny Tim Pendleton, UD, with a score of 193—his Drop on Recall in this class was absolutely stunning. (By the way, I have just heard that Timmy has achieved his 4th UDX leg, on March 27.) Second place was Gidget's Cinnamon Prince UD, owned by Mike and Carolyn Smith. This dog showed some very pretty heeling and came up with a score of 192 1/2. The less said about Open A, the better. My Oliver acted as if he had never been in an Obedience ring in his life. But he heeled spectacularly well outside the ring both before and after—does that count, Mr. Judge? First in Novice B was CH. Paughprint Endless Tradition, owned and shown by Paulette Zecca. This bouncy dog with an attitude and a very nice Recall earned a score of 186. Second in Novice A was Karen Wilson's Exotic Pride's Special Man. I enjoyed getting to know Karen at the specialty and hope to see her again.

After I gave an introduction to Rally as comprising many of the exercises that good handlers have used in the past to train their dogs for Obedience, my assistants, Shari Gangestad and Kristin Roberson, and others as well, set up two courses (Wendy Donnelly had graciously provided signs, numbers, and sign holders) while I discussed ways to perform each exercise. The participants then walked the course "without their dogs," which since the dogs were Poms, after all, meant they carried the dogs while walking the course. (That is not AKC-legal for real Rally Trials, of course. I think it must be to avoid giving small dogs the advantage over bigger dogs. Can you see someone walking a course carrying a Great Dane?) After everyone had a chance to walk the course and ask questions, each participant ran the course while I critiqued it for the group. They were all good about this, and I think everyone got to see that what looks easy when you are watching it from outside the ring can be much more difficult when you get into the ring with your dog and you are under pressure to find the next station, read the sign, figure out what it means, and actually do it WITH your dog.

Spectators were invited to ask questions also, and a lot of them had some very good ones that allowed me to point out things I had not previously planned or thought of.

Some highlights from the workshop: Shari suggesting that we all chant the count on the 1,2,3 steps exercises to help whoever was in the ring keep up with the steps. The group really got into this, and any hotel staff wandering around must have marveled at the chant drifting out into the halls, "Heel, Sit! Heel, Two, Sit! Heel, Two, Three, Sit!" I think by the time that one was done everyone was able to keep their feet "moving in time to the music." Another highlight: the excited reaction from those who had not yet had any exposure to Rally when they heard that an Incorrect Performance of an exercise that had just cost them 10 points (out of a possible 100) could be changed to a -3 point loss just by going back a few steps and doing the whole exercise again correctly. And then there was the person outside the ring who introduced herself as a Poodle owner and asked if she could also ask questions. I noticed someone in the audience taking COPIOUS notes in a notebook. I hope she got some useful information.

I had a wonderful time doing this workshop, and would like to thank everyone who participated in any way, whether as enrollee, helper, or just being there to watch. Rally is fun, no matter how you participate!

WORDS, WORDS, WORDS

We had an interesting discussion about command words not long ago on the Active Pomeranian e-list (ActivePomeranian-subscribe@yahoo.com). Helen Brinn said: "I have one Pom I did not think I would ever be able to train to Down. Come to find out he did not like the word 'Down' alone; I had to say 'Lay Down.' After that it took me only two weeks to get him to be reliable on his Down. In two weeks, he was Downing with just a hand signal." [Side note on this—"Lay Down" breaks this English teacher's heart, but I know I'm fighting a losing battle.]

I can imagine some folks being skeptical about this, but not me. I have a "slow learner," Taffy, now 12 years old. (Really, he's not dumb, he just learns slowly.) When I tried to teach him the Novice Stand for Examination, he didn't exactly sit, he simply sank his rear end to the floor. This went on for a period of MONTHS until the time that I was trying to support his rear with my hand under his belly and he submissively urinated. OOPS! So I quit trying to teach him. (And no, I didn't use any naughty words, but I sure thought them!) Six months later, hoping to avoid any previous negative associations, I used the Indonesian word for stand. This weird little dog said, "Why didn't you say so?" and immediately did a perfect stand, was able to be left and examined with no problems.

Do I think it was really that he speaks Indonesian? No, I think it was a combination of things: The new word did not have old negative associations (which I was trying to avoid); the lengthy time period gave him a chance to, as it were, catch his breath and regroup; and there was a certain sense in which that is how this dog learns—time off allows the information to finally sink in and take effect. I had a similar experience teaching Taffy the retrieve. No success at all, followed by a 6 month hiatus, resulted in perfection. But if you have a lot of problems with a particular command, do try changing the word. Remember that AKC allows you to use any word, in any language, in the ring.

When I was looking for a second Pomeranian to do Obedience with, I contacted Mary Vickers, then president of the American Pomeranian Club, and owner of Annon's Huggy Bear from Scamp UD. She had a litter coming that was fathered by Huggy, but unfortunately lost all three puppies. But she did have an older puppy from Huggy that she had not been able to place, one she was sure would be good in Obedience. She had actually advertised him in the *Pomeranian Review* with a picture taken of him in a refrigerator, along with the suggestion that his new owner should "stuff his tummy with good food and his mind with obedience lessons." (This had the effect of making him notorious in the Pom fancy as "the refrigerator dog.") After seeing a video of him, I agreed that this would be my new dog, and so Tuffy came home to me at the age of 10 ½ months. (Who says you have to get a dog at exactly 7 weeks to do competition with him?)



From the beginning, Tuffy loved to train and show. Mary had started him off well with Puppy Kindergarten, so he had a good puppy background and continued to have a really solid work ethic. Tuffy did anything I asked of him, once he

understood it, and so we did a variety of activities—Obedience, Agility, Freestyle, Pet Therapy, and finally, in his “retirement years,” Rally. Although his heart was enlarged at the last, and he spent much of his time sleeping, any suggestion that he might want to “work” would bring him to instant joyful attention. The vet said to let him do what he wanted to do, and so two days after he was diagnosed with congested lungs and put on medication for that, he got his first Rally Novice leg (January 8). He finished his Rally Advanced title and earned one Rally Excellent leg on the weekend of February 26 and 27. Just over a week later, his heart became too large to keep his body going. Tuffy was my heart-dog, and part of my heart went with him.

Collapsing Trachea

The trachea, also known as the windpipe, is an important structure that connects the throat to the lungs and directs air into the lungs. The trachea lies centrally through the throat. The normal trachea is tubular. When viewed on end, the windpipe is a U-shaped structure with a tight membrane covering the top. It maintains its shape because of a series of rings made of cartilage. These rings do not completely encircle the trachea. They extend approximately 2/3 of the way around it with the remainder of the trachea being composed of a flexible membrane that joins the ends of the cartilage rings together. When the cartilage rings flatten from the top to the bottom, the trachea is collapsed. Rapid inhalation can cause the weakened rings to flatten, making it difficult for air to enter the lungs.

It is not completely understood how the condition develops, but it is known that many dogs with collapsing trachea have an abnormal chemical makeup to tracheal rings. The rings lose their rigidity and are unable to retain their shape allowing the softened area to collapse, thus obstructing the passage of air into the lungs. Collapsing trachea usually manifests in dogs of middle age. The condition tends to occur more often in certain breeds, namely small and toy breeds, including the Pomeranian. Because of this breed predisposition it is suspected that there is a genetic component involved in this condition. However, it is also known that trauma to the trachea such as that caused by excessive force applied to a leash or the use of oversized tracheal tubes during surgical intubations can cause a collapsing trachea or exacerbate the condition when it is already present.

The most common clinical sign of a collapsing trachea is a chronic cough. The cough is dry and harsh and can become quite debilitating. The cough is often described as sounding like a “goose honk” or “the croup”. The cough can often be triggered by excitement, light pressure on the trachea (such as that from a leash) or from drinking water or eating.

A chronic cough, especially a “croupy, goose honk cough” should be suspect and evaluated by a veterinarian. Many times, very light pressure placed on the trachea during the veterinary examination can trigger the cough resulting in the diagnosis of collapsing trachea. While the information gathered from the physical exam is helpful, other tests are needed to rule out other possible causes for the cough such as infection or heart disease.

X-rays of the chest can identify the trachea and determine its shape. However, a collapsing trachea changes its diameter during the respiratory cycle. It usually collapses during inhalation and appears normal during exhalation. Thus, endoscopy is a more accurate way to conclusively diagnose a collapsing trachea. An endoscope is a tube that is small enough to insert into the trachea and allows the operator to see the inside of the trachea. By watching the trachea during inspiration and expiration, abnormal collapsing can be seen. Tracheal endoscopes are expensive and not available at every veterinary hospital and the procedure is also not without some risk. Thus many veterinarians and their clients opt to forgo such testing and begin treatment based on the physical exam and clinical history, reserving the endoscopic procedure for those cases that do not respond favorably to medical treatment. Collapsing trachea can be treated medically or surgically. Some dogs respond well to bronchodilators and various types of anti-inflammatory drugs. The trachea of affected dogs is easily infected, so antibiotics are usually part of the treatment. If obesity is present, weight loss is often beneficial. Excitement and vigorous exercise are likely to cause a relapse, so they should be avoided as much as possible. A low dose sedative as prescribed by a veterinarian may be useful in preventing an aggravation of symptoms during times of stress. Some dogs respond well to

medication, others do not. Because medical therapy only treats the symptoms and does not correct the problem, affected dogs are always subject to recurrence of coughing and breathing difficulty. However, many dogs with uncomplicated collapsing trachea have lived relatively normal lives of normal duration.

If medical therapy is not successful, the dog may be evaluated for possible surgery. Radiographs and endoscopy are used to determine what area of the trachea is collapsing. If the abnormal area is between the throat and the point where the trachea enters the chest, surgery may be curative. However, if the abnormal area is in the chest cavity, surgery is not going to be helpful because this area is not accessible to the surgeon. There are several surgical approaches that have been used. Each approach implants an artificial support device that is secured around or within the trachea. The purpose of the support device is to hold the tracheal rings in their normal, open position. Although some dogs have excellent results and are relieved of their symptoms, the outcome of surgery is usually not completely successful.

At the current time there is not enough research to conclusively determine whether the condition is hereditary. However, it is suspected that a genetic predisposition exists in some breeds, especially toy breeds. There are no official breeding recommendations concerning the condition. Breeding affected dogs is at the discretion of the owner and treating veterinarian. However, when contemplating whether to breed an affected dog, regard to the well being of the dog should always be of the foremost concern. When breeding a dog with a mild collapsing trachea the breeder must be fully aware of the potential of passing the disorder on to future generations. Any offspring resulting from the breeding of an affected dog should be closely monitored for signs of the disorder. The hereditary potential of this disorder should not be discounted, even when it is thought that an individual case is the result of tracheal trauma.
